Too busy to make your own canapés? There's a great selection available in the shops or by mail order. KEITH RICHMOND tests six of the best

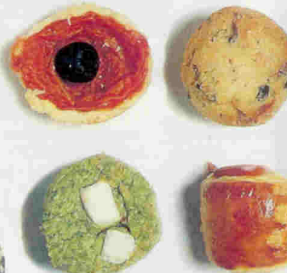


▲ Donald Russell Canapé Quiches (£22 for two trays of 25). These may be expensive, but they're worth it: the pastry is delicate and the fillings are light and tasty – potato, cheese and

Asda Extra Special Dressed Mussels (£3.48 for nine). These aren't the easiest things to eat – served in their shells, they're too hot to handle after cooking – but if you put them on a plate and use small forks, they taste divine. Visit www.asda.co.uk
